## NEW SCOTLAND LIBRARY BRANCH

I wanted to share the latest on the plans for our New Scotland library: The Albany library has contracted with an architect to do the design work for the two new building projects, New Scotland and Arbor Hill. The firm that was selected, Kevin Hom and Andrew Goldman Architects (H+G), is a New York City firm with impressive experience designing public buildings, including public libraries around the country.

As requested at the last HNA meeting, the library will host a meeting for New Scotland residents to introduce H+G and to exchange ideas on preliminary library concepts. The meeting will be held at St. Teresa's Social Center on the corner of Hollywood and New Scotland at 6:00 pm on Thursday, October 11. Tim Burke, the Interim Library Director, and Board members will also attend to provide a project update and answer any other questions regarding the project.

I want to reassure you that the basic decisions we negotiated as a neighborhood prior to the referendum have been clearly communicated to H+G. We will still get our own neighborhood library that will be built on the open lot next to the New Scotland fire station and on the adjacent lot, where a house now stands. No more than the agreed upon \$4 million will be spent on the library; it will be no larger than the previously specified 9,450 square feet. The library will still include rooms for community meetings that will be accessible when the library is closed, a young adult room, and expanded children's space.

Library administrators and the Library Board have also communicated to the architect other features of the preliminary pre-referendum design, such as limited parking, the importance of preserving as many of the walnut trees as possible, and an interest in maintaining some open space on the property. With these issues in mind, the project architect, Kevin Hom, will draw upon his significant design experience to design the best libraries possible - inside and out - for our neighborhood and for Arbor Hill/West Hill.

Some people have asked me: Why was a new architect hired? Here's the story:

Collins & Scoville was hired as the pre-referendum architect. Following the overwhelming passage of the \$29 million library bond referendum in February, the Library Board decided to award Collins & Scoville with the design work for the three renovation projects (Pine Hills, Howe and Delaware). However, they wanted to ensure a diversity of design and cast a wider net for architects with library experience and made the decision to conduct an open and national search for the design team to work on the two new libraries. Many qualified firms, including Collins & Scoville, expressed interest in the projects, but H+G was the unanimous choice of the selection committee, which consisted of board members, library administrators, and staff from the Dormitory Authority who is serving as the Library's project manager.

**New Scotland Library Wins National Excellence Award from the  
Young Adult Services Association of American Library Association**

Wednesday, July 18th, 2007

The New Scotland Branch of the Albany Public Library has won an "Excellence in Library Service to Young Adults" award for the innovative Skateboarding Discussion Group. The program was chosen as one of only five projects nationally to receive the award, presented by the Young Adult Library Services Association (YALSA).

YALSA's Excellence Award Task Force selected 25 exemplary teen programs/services in all types of libraries. The top five programs received cash awards of \$1,000 each and the other twenty "best of the rest" applications received cash awards of \$250. All programs will be featured in the fifth edition of the YALSA publication, *Excellence in Library Service to Young Adults*, which will be available in Spring 2008.

The program was the brainchild of UAlbany graduate student Damon Vorce and was developed in collaboration with New Scotland Branch Librarian Melissa Wasilewski as part of Damon's internship with the Albany Public Library. 'Skate Program' was begun during the summer of 2006 and continued weekly at the New Scotland Branch Library until June of this year when the program

was moved to the Pine Hills Branch Library. Under Melissa's guidance the group continues to meet to watch skate videos, give media recommendations, and collaborate on projects using popular teen mediums such as YouTube, GoogleMaps, and MySpace. "This unique program brings teens and tweens into the library using their interest in skateboarding and the skateboarding culture as the hook," says Interim Library Director Timothy Burke.

The program effectively turns the potential problem of skateboarders hanging around outside the library, into an opportunity to demonstrate to young people that the library can be "cool," thereby increasing library use by teens.

In February of this year, Albany voters overwhelmingly approved a \$29.1 million bond act to relocate, renovate and build five libraries in the City of Albany. Designs for all five libraries include dedicated tween/teen spaces with computers and expanded young adult collections. To effectively plan and implement innovative teen programs for the new spaces, the Albany Public Library recently named Melissa Wasilewski Branch Librarian for Teen Services.

**Tips to Prevent Home Burglary**

Our neighborhood has been struck by periodic daytime burglaries, as have several other Albany neighborhoods this year. Burglars "case" the homes beforehand and don't seem to be stopped by alarm system signs. Here are some suggestions to keep your home safe, especially when you are not home:

- Close the blinds or shades, so no one can see what you have that's waiting to be stolen. (In summer, this helps keep your house cool, too.)
- Close and lock all ground floor windows and doors—and your garage door. It's amazing how many neighbors keep their garage doors open.
- Leave a radio or TV on low in the back of the house—it will give the impression that someone is home.
- Leave one or more lights on, or use timers in the bathroom, kitchen (windows are usually covered) or an upstairs bedroom. Change the locations of your lights periodically during the week.
- If you see people acting as if they are "casing the street" note their description and call the Albany Police (438-4000) immediately.
- The best burglary prevention is a DOG inside the house. Burglars don't like barking dogs!

Anyone walking down Grove Avenue this summer has probably noticed a bevy of house repair activities with saws buzzing, hammers swinging and paint brushes gliding.
